

# Bylaw 2 — The Removal Provisions

*Sections 4F and 4G of the Constitution and Bylaws*

## Source

The provisions below appear in the Constitution and Bylaws of Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity (2024). They are reproduced here for reference. The reader is invited to read the operative language directly.

## Removals

### Section 4F.

The Grand Boulé may, upon a majority vote of its members, present and voting at any meeting, remove a Grand Board Member for any reason.

### Section 4G.

The Grand Board may, upon a two-thirds affirmative vote of the *entire* Grand Board present and voting at any meeting, remove a Grand Board member for the following:

1. Misconduct in office.
2. Negligence in the performance of his responsibilities, or
3. Non-compliance with the Grand Boulé Governance Laws.

An automatic removal of a Grand Board member shall occur when he is:

1. Judicially declared of unsound mind, or
2. Convicted of an offense punishable by imprisonment for a term of more than one year.

## Footnote 10

Note: Sections 4F and 4G address removal of Grand Board members. It makes *no* restrictions on the Grand Boulé because of its status as the governing body but *does impose restrictions on the Grand Board*.
